INCENTIVE AVAILABILITY: Incentive qualifications and amounts are subject to change or termination at any time. Incentives will be processed on first-come, first-served basis.

INCENTIVE QUALIFICATIONS: Qualifying ductless heat pumps can be installed in site-built single-family or manufactured homes. Limited to one unit installed per household. Ductless heat pumps must be installed by a participating HVAC contractor. A list of Participating Contractors can be found at www.idahopower.com/ductless.

QUALIFYING APPLICANTS: Residential customers of Idaho Power living in single-family site built or manufactured home and use permanently installed zonal electric resistance heating as their PRIMARY heat source may qualify. Homes heated with fossil fuel systems or central electric systems (electric furnace or ducted heat pump system) are not eligible to participate.

QUALIFYING EQUIPMENT: All equipment must be new and purchased and installed prior to submitting an incentive application. Equipment must have been purchased and installed on or after January 1st, 2010. Qualifying equipment must be: (i) a split system heat pump employing an inverter-driven, variable-speed compressor, a variable speed outdoor fan, and a multi-speed or variable speed indoor blower, and (ii) installed with the indoor unit in the main living area of the house. Additionally, indoor units using any type of field-installed duct system are not eligible. Contractors are required to install rigid line set covers on all exterior lines. Any remaining lines between the rigid hide and the outdoor unit must be wrapped with UV tape.

CONTRACTOR ELIGIBILITY: Contractors must be licensed and maintain general liability insurance coverage and workers compensation, as required by law, and have successfully completed manufacturer sponsored training for equipment being installed. Contractors must represent the DHP Pilot to IPC customers in a truthful and accurate manner and also provide quality and timely customer service. Contractors found not to comply with any of these requirements may be rendered ineligible for participation.

SAFETY AND BUILDING CODES: The contractor agrees to pursue compliance with federal, state, and local building codes for the installation of this product. The contractor certifies products have been installed consistent with manufacturer instructions.

VERIFICATION AND INSPECTION: Participating home sites are subject to on-site inspections in order to verify that the system meets IPC requirements and that the home meets eligibility guidelines. Systems will be randomly chosen. No warranty is implied by this inspection.

APPLICATION DETAILS: Applications must include all information requested. Failure to provide this information may result in the delay or denial of the incentive. Idaho Power reserves the right to conduct random on-site inspections to verify information provided on the application. Idaho Power issues incentives in the form of checks and not utility bill credits. Idaho Power is not responsible if your HVAC company, who provides and installs the equipment, provides inaccurate information about the amount and/or conditions of the actual incentive. Idaho Power will not pay incentives for equipment that is mislabeled or misrepresented regarding incentive qualifications. Households receiving incentives under the Idaho Power ductless Heat Pump Pilot may not receive incentives for the same equipment under another company program.
