### The Hells Canyon Hydroelectric Complex

Idaho Power Company's Hells Canyon Hydroelectric Complex is licensed by the Federal Energy Regulatory Commission (FERC) as Project No. 1971. The project area is shown on the map and consists of three hydroelectric facilities (Brownlee, Oxbow and Hells Canyon Dams). Here, the river forms the border between the states of Idaho and Oregon. Idaho Power Company operates and maintains five overnight

camping facilities within the Complex. Woodhead, McCormick, Carters Landing, Copperfield and Hells Canyon Parks. These facilities are provided for all members of the public without discrimination. The reservoirs and associated recreational facilities provide visitors with the opportunities for boating, fishing, camping, hunting, wildlife viewing, hiking, and a variety of other activities. The water temperatures and diverse underwater habitat provide homes to several fish species, including catfish, crappie, bass and trout. Idaho Power has also cooperated with federal, state and local agencies to enhance other facilities that provide public access to this area of the Snake River. Idaho Power has made efforts to protect and enhance water quality, fish, wildlife, botanical, historic, archaeological, and aesthetics resources associated with this and other hydro projects.
