What Is Energy Assistance?

Energy Assistance is a federally funded program for qualified households, which provides a one-time benefit (per program year) to assist with home energy costs.

How Do I Qualify?

Eligibility for Energy Assistance is based on a number of factors including household size and income as outlined in the chart.

Important Note

Applications are not mailed automatically each year. You must contact your local Community Action Partnership Agency (see list on back) to receive an appointment time and qualify for assistance. You will need to provide the agency with your account and service agreement numbers from your most current Idaho Power bill or notice.
