What Is Energy Assistance?

Energy assistance is a federally funded program for qualified households, which provides a one-time benefit (per program year) to assist with heating costs. The program year runs from November 2006 through April 2007.

How Do I Qualify?

Eligibility for energy assistance is based on a number of factors including household size and income as outlined in the chart.

Applications will not be mailed automatically. You must contact your local Community Action Partnership Agency (see list on back) to receive an application and qualify for assistance.
