

Scholarship Application

Larry Wimer Memorial Scholarship

Larry Wimer was born in Cottonwood, Idaho on March 27, 1947. He graduated from high school in 1965. He graduated from the University of Idaho with a bachelor's degree in fish and wildlife biology and began working for Idaho Power as a fisheries biologist in 1981. He later became the Company's fisheries program coordinator, managing its four anadromous fish hatcheries. Finally, Larry served as manager of Idaho Power's Hydro Relicensing projects.

He served on the boards of directors for the Northwest and National Hydropower Associations. Larry was an active member of the Regulatory Affairs Committee and the Legislative Committee, served on the task force for relicensing reform, and was a member of the American Fisheries Society.

About the Scholarship

The Larry Wimer Memorial Scholarship has been established by the Wimer family, friends, co-workers, and Idaho Power Company. The scholarship is available to college students in their junior or senior year, enrolled in the University of Idaho's Department of Natural Resources. In recognition of the student's accomplishments, the scholarship seeks to provide partial assistance in attaining a college education.

The Awards

The program provides a one-time \$500 student fee/tuition grant for University of Idaho juniors and seniors, who are enrolled in the Department of Natural Resources.

Eligibility

The program is open to Department of Natural Resources majors only. Applicants must be students enrolled as full-time students in the undergraduate program.

Application Requirements

The student is responsible for gathering and submitting the following information:

- The completed scholarship application form.
- A statement of between 300 and 600 words, prepared by the applicant, summarizing curricular and extra-curricular activities and accomplishments. The statement should also address itself to the applicant's qualifications, goals, and objectives for the higher education, and how that education can promote conservation of the environment.
- Official college grade transcripts.
- Three letters of recommendation describing the character, personality traits, and academic achievements of the applicant. One or two of these letters must be from teachers, counselors, or administrators; and one must be from a community leader or employer (not related to the applicant) who has had an opportunity to personally observe the applicant's character and initiative.
- Exhibits (optional) showing notable achievement in scholarship, leadership, athletics, dramatics, literature and community service. Please submit reproductions of exhibits instead of originals.

The entire application should not exceed 15 pages, one side only including the application form. An elaborate presentation is not necessary; however, carelessness will be taken into consideration by the selection committee. The application should be bound (paper pocket binder is acceptable).

Selection of Recipients

Recipients of the Larry Wimer Memorial Scholarship are chosen by an independent selection committee consisting of company employees and Wimer family members.

Academic achievement, leadership potential, and school/community involvement are the criteria by which the applicants will be judged. The following selection standards will be used:

- Academic achievement 40 points
- Leadership potential 30 points
- School/community involvement 30 points

Selection of recipients will be made no later than April 1. Applicants will be notified of the selection committee's decisions by mail.

Application Deadline

All scholarship applications must be postmarked by March 1.
